Pumping Crew's List of Things to Bring to On-the-Road Jobs

Here is a list of items you might consider bringing along to job assignments in which you are needing to stay overnight while on assignment over 50 miles from Columbus, NE.

General Pack List

- ☐ 6 or more work shirts

- ☐ Nicer clothes to use for day off
- ☐ Nicer clothes to go to church or out to eat
- ☐ Lounge around slippers or flip flops
- ☐ Nice shoes for day off
- ☐ Work boots (High top – laced)
- ☐ Alarm Clock
- ☐ iPad or Laptop computer for off duty emails, games (save your money and buy it later)

Toiletries

- ☐ Toothbrush & toothpaste
- ☐ Shaver & shaving cream
- ☐ Bath soap (motel's soaps are pretty lame)
- ☐ Deodorant
- ☐ Cologne
- ☐ Vicks or Vaseline for nose
- ☐ Small Kleenex packs for use on job
- ☐ Laundry basket
- ☐ Laundry soap
- ☐ Lots of quarters for laundry mat

Eat in Hotel Room Considerations

- ☐ Plate, bowl, mug, glass for one person (microwave safe)
- ☐ Knife, fork, spoon for one person
- ☐ Small sharp steak or cutting knife
- ☐ Small cutting board
- ☐ Dish cloth, dish towel, dish soap
- ☐ Roll of paper towel
- ☐ Dry cereal, bread, peanut butter, jelly, condiments for hot dogs, etc.

Eat on the Job Considerations

- ☐ Insulated lunch bag or small cooler
- ☐ Small refreeze ice packs for cooler
- ☐ Sandwich bags or re-useable container

Summer Clothes Considerations

- ☐ Jean shorts (you may wish for long pants due to weeds, bugs and to keep clean)
- ☐ 6 or more short-sleeve t-shirts
- ☐ SPF-15 suntan lotion
- ☐ Mosquitoes or bug repellent
- ☐ Cap to shade eyes
- ☐ Safety "wrap-around" sunglasses
- ☐ Leather work gloves
- ☐

Winter Clothes Considerations

- ☐ 6 or more long sleeve flannel or wool shirts
- ☐ 2 or more pair long underwear
- ☐ Insulated vest (Carhart is a good brand)
- ☐ Insulated Jacket with hood
- ☐ Insulated bib style work coveralls
- ☐ Warm insulated work gloves
- ☐ Insulated boots
- ☐

Personal on the Job Items

- ☐ Work boots (High top - laced)
- ☐ Cell phone
- ☐ iPod or MP3 player (If desired)
- ☐ Approved ear piece (Must not fit into ear or cover ear – Must be able to hear radio and hold conversation without having to remove ear piece)
- ☐ Pocket knife
- ☐ Pliers or Multi-tool in belt pouch (not necessary, but really nice to have)
- ☐ Baseball cap to shade eyes
- ☐ Safety glasses and safety sunglasses
- ☐ Bright small flashlight (75 lumens or better)

Food can be purchased at local grocery stores, can be bought from fast food restaurants or convenience stores.

You are paid a \$30 per day per diem to cover your food. Personal size "microwave ready" meals that do not need refrigeration is best. One brand that is excellent is Hormel's "Compl-eats." Most motels have a small refrigerator and a small microwave in each room. Most motels have TV's for news and movies; and wireless internet for emails and games.

Pack your items in a suitcase or plastic tub so it can ride in the back of a pick-up without fear of it blowing away.
